<b>Date</b>	<b>Event</b>	<b>Comment</b>
<b>Saturday 16th July</b>	Start of Cruise Dinner	This will take place in the RSrn Club. For those that would like a berth for the evening please contact <a href="#">Michael Lithgow</a> .
<b>Sunday 17th July</b>	Breakfast Briefing at RSrn	Over coffee and croissants, a relaxing start to the day with the Cruise and Racing Brief.
<b>Sunday 17th July</b>	Leg 1 - Hamble to Yarmouth	15nm. Berths have been booked for the Cruise at Yarmouth. Pontoon drinks in the evening.
<b>Monday 18th July</b>	Leg 2 - Yarmouth to Alderney	65nm. This is one of the longest legs with an early start around 0600ish. Full briefing will be provided for those who are crossing the Channel for the 1st time. You will be in company all of the way. We will either pick up a buoy or anchor in Braye Harbour
<b>Tuesday 19th July</b>	Alderney - Rest Day	A day free to explore the Island. We will arrange a beach BBQ for those that would like to join in the early evening.
<b>Wednesday 20th July</b>	Leg 3 Alderney to St Peter Port	22nm with the tide aiding you down to St Peter Port, Guernsey. An early start to make the most of the tide and a mid-morning finish. We will have walk-ashore pontoons.
<b>Thursday 21st July</b>	Guernsey - Rest Day	Time to unwind on this beautiful island.
<b>Friday 22nd July</b>	Herm Hog Roast	We are exploring laying on a Hog Roast on Herm with a local ferry to take us across and back for those who do not wish to sail and anchor the very short distance - 6nm.
<b>Saturday 23rd July</b>	Leg 4 - St Peter Port to St Helier	22nm. Not too early a start and a mid-day finish in Jersey. Walk-ashore pontoons.
<b>Sunday 24th July</b>	St Helier - Rest Day	A chance to explore Gerald Durrell's Zoo on Jersey or to spend time cycling around the island.
<b>Monday 25th July</b>	St Herlier - Sark	7nm. A short trip. We will be anchoring, and choice of location will depend on wind direction.
<b>Tuesday 26th July</b>	Sark- Rest Day	An island where time has stood still. No motor vehicles allowed. Just the peace and quiet of a unique island.
<b>Wednesday 27th July</b>	Leg 5 - Sark to Alderney	22nm. An early start to catch the north going tide. But that does mean we get into Braye quite early. Buoy or anchor. We will have our end of cruise supper and prize giving that evening.
<b>Thursday 28th July</b>	Alderney - Home	66nm to Yarmouth. We will have an early start around 0600. This will get us to the Needles with enough tide to sail all the way through to the Hamble or for those that would like a couple more days before returning to the helter-skelter of normal living there is the option to stop off at Yarmouth or Lymington.
